GREEK REFUGEE SETTLEMENT COMMISSION.

Resignation of Sir John Campbell.

The Secretary-General has the honour to circulate to the Council a letter from Sir John Campbell, member of the Greek Refugee Settlement Commission, announcing his resignation from the Commission.

The question of the appointment of a successor to Sir John Campbell is being added to the Provisional Agenda of the forthcoming meeting of the Council.

Athens, 11th November, 1926.

I have the honour to request that you will be good enough to submit, to the Council of the League, my resignation as member of the Refugee Settlement Commission appointed by the Council.

I regret very much that it should have been necessary for me to resign, but private reasons render this course imperative. It will be necessary for me to leave Greece between the 8th and the 13th January 1927; I would suggest that, if possible, my successor should arrive in Athens a day or two prior to my departure.
