TRAFFIC IN OPIUM AND OTHER DANGEROUS DRUGS.

ANNUAL REPORTS BY GOVERNMENTS FOR 1943.

KENYA.

Communicated by the Government of the United Kingdom.

Note by the Acting Secretary-General.

In accordance with Article 21 of the Convention of 1931 for limiting the Manufacture and regulating the Distribution of Narcotic Drugs, the Acting Secretary-General has the honour to communicate the above-mentioned report to the parties to the Convention. The report is also communicated to other States and to the Advisory Committee on Traffic in Opium and other Dangerous Drugs.

A. GENERAL.

I. Laws and Publications.

1. No new laws, orders or regulations have been issued during the year on the question of opium or other dangerous drugs.

II. Administration.

2. No difficulties have been met with in regard to the administration of the Dangerous Drugs Ordinance and Rules. There appears to be no increase in the use of bhang by natives.

V. Illicit Traffic.

3. 418 prosecutions were instituted and 397 convictions were obtained during the year. Penalties inflicted varied from a fine of Sh.5/- to twelve months hard labour.

5. About 505 lbs. (229 kg. 523 gr.) of cannabis sativa were confiscated during the year and were destroyed by burning.
